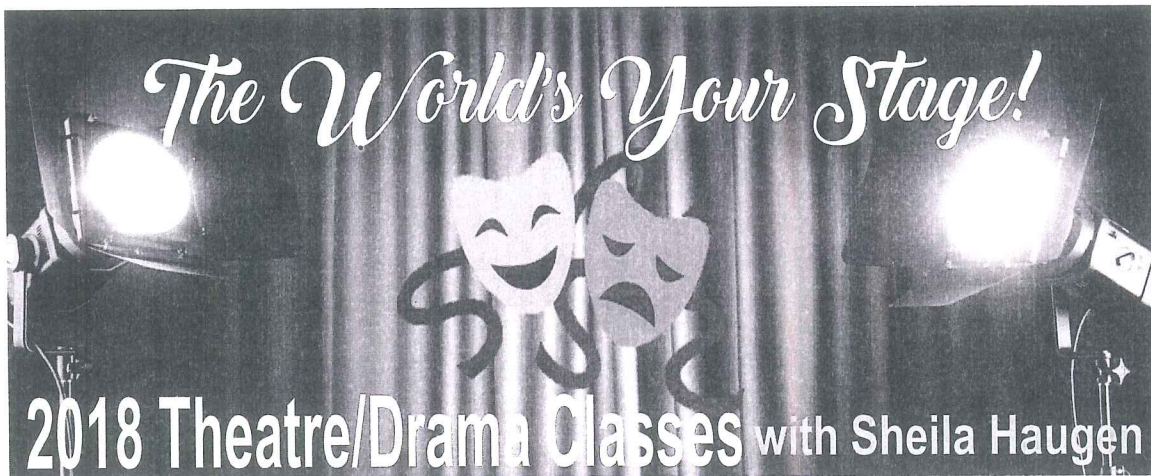


Kiwanis Performing Arts Centre

Teen-Age Monologues Class
(Age 13 – 16)
Thursdays 5:30 – 7:00 pm
February 8 to April 11, 2018

This course will use different aspects of theatre such as character, improvisation, basic theatre vocabulary, and monologue to explore subject areas of the student's choosing. Students themselves will take lead. Throughout this course, there will be a focus on individuality and group work. A performance will be held at the end of the session to showcase student work.

Youth Class
(Age 8-12)
Thursdays 3:45 – 5:15 pm
February 8 to April 11, 2018

This course will focus on character building and a review of theatre vocabulary and acting skills. All aspects of character will be explored on a much deeper level. Costumes, hair, make-up (basic), props will also be added as they are part of character portrayal. Students will be required to do two written character sketches one of their choosing, one from the instructor. A variety show will end the course, which will consist of all characters taking the stage in different situations.
